First Time Reading Bunnyzine?

Hi! Welcome to Bunnyzine.

Bunnyzine is a magazine created to help rabbit rescues and rabbit-related causes. Let's jump into a Q&A on what Bunnyzine is and why you clicking on our download and reading our issue each month is very important to us.

What is Bunnyzine?

Bunnyzine is a free monthly digital community rabbit magazine. We aim to focus on rabbit stories in mainstream media, but more importantly, in our own community.

How does Bunnyzine help rabbits?

Aside from promoting rescues and rabbit fundraisers for people to participate in, our ultimate goal is to become a self-sustaining, financial conduit between advertiser to rescue/rabbit-related cause. It works on a simple breakdown.

- You download and read Bunnyzine
- Advertisers pay us to be in Bunnyzine.
- We use 80% of the ad revenue in the magazine to give to rabbit rescues/related causes.

The more readers we have, the more we can charge advertisers, the more we can help bunnies so sharing and downloading are important.

Why only 80%? Why not 100%?

Currently, Bunnyzine is run by unpaid volunteers whom have put in a lot of time and effort while maintaining jobs. There are a few key positions that will really require full time positions to be filled and

it is unreasonable to expect them to be unpaid. There are also additional expenses we already face that come out of pocket so having those covered by Bunnyzine's revenue stream is appropriate for Bunnyzine to be self-sustaining.

What about other revenue sources?

We are currently examining other revenue sources, such as patreon, but are not considering them part of the 80%/20% advertising income model. I am hopeful though that additional revenue sources will enable us to increase the 80% going to help rabbits to a higher percentage.



What do you mean by rabbit-related causes?

Rabbit-related causes may still (and often would) involve a rabbit rescue. These causes might be something like an emergency medical issue a rabbit is fundraising for, a feral rabbit rescue operation, efforts towards shutting down a rabbit farming operation, or furthering education on rabbit care and the societal view of rabbits to decrease the number of abandoned rabbits and to end the use of rabbits as food or product.

Does Bunnyzine support breeders?

No.

There is a big debate about responsible breeders and irresponsible breeders but, at the end of the day, Bunnyzine's focus is to help rabbit rescues and unwanted/abandoned rabbits, or rabbits being used a product or food. It's less about being against breeders and more about being supportive to the efforts of rabbit rescues.

Does Bunnyzine support the use of rabbits

as food or product (fur clothing, etc)?

No.

Bunnyzine believes in the health and happiness of all bunnies. Ideally, we would love to see bunnies adorned with similar views that cats and dogs have in a North American society.

Does Bunnyzine support hutches or outdoor bunnies?

BZ is focused on promoting rabbit welfare first & foremost, irrespective of where a rabbit lives. Our audience is international in scope and as such, rabbits live many different ways around the world. BZ strives to cover issues that interest rabbit-lovers and respect the dignity of the rabbit.

We understand that there are going to be varying definitions of what is considered adequate care and not everyone will agree to a particular definition but the aspects of rabbits that Bunnyzine supports is the safety, well-being, love, and the quality of life being provided for the rabbit,

Does Bunnyzine have any paid advertising?

Presently, no, and we are not actively engaging in acquiring any paid advertisers.

Why aren't you getting paid advertisers?

Right now, we are in the reader acquisition phase. We need to have a large enough readership to approach advertisers.

If an advertiser advertises for us while our readership numbers are low, the chances of them getting a return on their advertising costs (from sales) is also low and if they aren't getting a return on what they spend, they will view Bunnyzine as ineffective for their advertising strategies. We don't want advertisers coming in early and leaving with a bad taste in their mouth so our first step is to demonstrate a steady regular

readership number that is high enough to give advertisers a decent chance of sales generated through ads with Bunnyzine.

So, you want readers to buy from the advertisers?

If they want to. Readers who purchase from advertisers reinforce the idea that Bunnyzine is a worthwhile magazine for advertisers to place ads in. Having said that, we will not ask readers to make purchases. It is the advertisers job in creating an effective ad that will generate the sales, our part in this is to give them a large number of readers to increase their chances and make it worth their while.

What is your target number?

We are testing with 1000 readers.

Last month, with the help of the Bunnyzine community sharing and spreading the word, we reached 1000 downloads. We do not know if 1000 readers is large enough to make advertisers satisfied with placing ads with us but we have a test in place to test whether this will be a high enough number to be effective. We will be testing it out over the next few months to see if we can begin with paid advertising or if we need to grow more before beginning the advertising acquisition phase.

What do you need from readers?

All we need is for you to download our regular issues once a month and read Bunnyzine. If we had 10 000 people doing that monthly, we could easily get the advertisers and, in turn, help the rabbits.

Of course, you can additionally help speed up the process by sharing our download posts from facebook and twitter to help people become aware of what Bunnyzine is and what we intend to do. You can help make this happen. You can help us build a system where rabbits can get help without it costing you a penny.

Can you tell us what you remember about your time before finding your forever home?

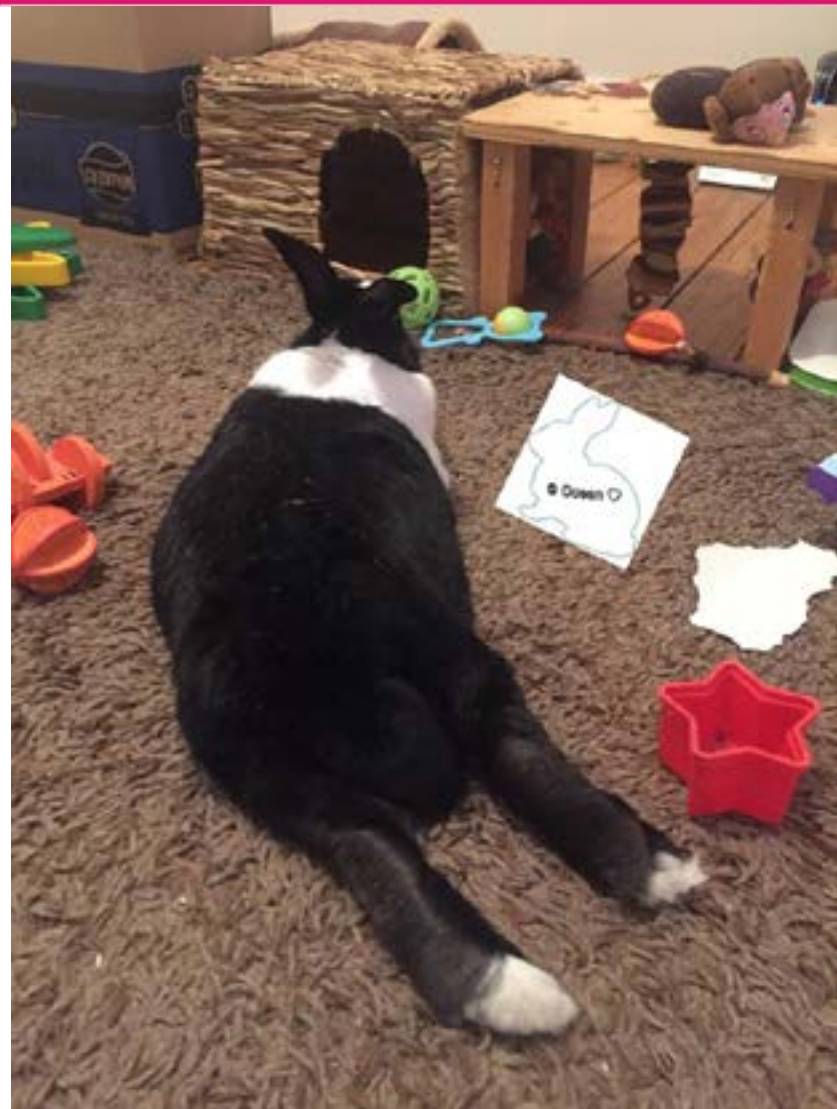
Daisy: Daisy did not has a nice time before mees finds minds forever home..... Daisy was bought into The Littlest Rescue wiv mines sisfur

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Byron And Huggs - Update Interview

Bunnyzine: In March 2018, we published a story in our issue Bunnyzine Vol. 4 Issue 5) about Byron Heino and his bunny, Huggs, getting connected to finding housing for his bunny and himself.

The story began with a comment Byron wrote on January 31st, 2018 under a Bunnyzine post on our Facebook page. The comment read "I can't find a place that's rabbit friendly, lots of places that are pet friendly, but rabbits are the exception, I'm fine with being homeless in Winnipeg and the -30 windchill but my bunny, Huggs, isn't." This prompted quick action from Bunnyzine Development



Team Member, Iris Klimczuk, to get Byron connected to help. She connected Byron with Popcorns and Binkies rescue and was able to establish temporary housing for him.

It's been about half a year since this happened and I, along with others, have been wondering what's been happening with Byron since. We thank Byron for giving us this interview. Let's just jump right in shall we?

Bunnyzine: Have you found more permanent housing?

Byron: Nothing yet, we're staying in a single room, Huggs doesn't have the space we had before but we're together.

Bunnyzine: Has life been improving for you since?

Byron: yes, less stressed from being homeless with Huggs.

Bunnyzine: What has been happening since we last saw you?

Byron: Started working with a concrete company, long hours usually start at 6am till 8pm



Bunnyzine: Have you stayed in touch with Popcorns and Binkies Rescue since?

Byron: yes, awesome people who are always asking how Huggs is and wondering if she needs anything.

Bunnyzine: How has Huggs been enjoying life now?

Bunnyzine: What have been some of the biggest challenges you've had to overcome since your temporary housing?

Byron: no real challenges, just getting up at 4:30-5am to get ready for work is a little rough

Bunnyzine: Do you have any big plans from here?

Byron: wouldn't mind getting some land a few acres outside of the city so I can build my own place and a garden.



Byron: she misses the yard and dancing in the rain but she's okay, just misses me bringing her fresh dandelions and other nibbles during the day.

Bunnyzine: Is there anything that you or Huggs needs that possibly Bunnyzine readers can help with?

Byron: \$1,000,000- and a Porsche? Nah I'm good thanks

Bunnyzine: Thank you so much for doing this interview with us and giving us an update on your story. I know a lot of us have been wondering.

Byron: thanks for being a source of rabbit education and entertainment.



Flying The Rabbit-Friendly Skies

Summertime means vacation and travelling, and some of you may be considering flying with your rabbit. Bunnyzine is pleased to reprint this article from last summer.

Please note it does NOT refer to flying with Emotional Support Animals/ESAs. US airlines have recently made major changes to their ESA policies, including restricting certain kinds of pets. If you have flown with your rabbit as an emotional support animal in the past, we recommend you inform yourself about the new stricter ESA requirements by contacting your chosen airline well in advance to avoid disappointment



Flying in-cabin with rabbits is easy with some advance planning. My own rabbit trio are now seasoned travellers and have flown from coast to coast, as well as to Canada and back.

Currently, only three major US airlines transport rabbits domestically in-cabin for a fee: Frontier, United, and Alaska Airlines. Westjet, serving Canadian destinations from a few US cities, is a fourth one. You'll need to phone the airline to let them know you're carrying a pet on-board with you after booking your own ticket online, since the number of pets allowed in-cabin per flight is limited.

Upon arrival at the airport, you'll need to line up for assistance so an agent can

check-in you and your rabbit/s, and to pay the additional pet transport fee. United and Frontier allow one rabbit per carrier in-cabin, while Alaska allows two rabbits per carrier in-cabin domestically (with the exception of flights to Hawaii).

Next, you will proceed to the trickiest part of flying with a rabbit, which is passing through TSA security. Here, your rabbit/s must be removed and carried thru the metal detector with you while their carrier is x-rayed separately. Once cleared, bunny can go back inside the pet carrier.

If your rabbit is at all skittish, ask the TSA agent for a private screening room where bunny will be contained should it decide to bolt. If you are travelling alone with a rabbit pair, you may need to ask a fellow traveller or TSA agent for assistance carrying your buns through security. Be prepared for lots of attention from curious travellers while clearing security!

Rabbits typically fly very well when healthy and veterinarians do not advise sedation. All animals must remain in their carriers for the duration of the flight for their safety.

A soft-sided, top and front-opening carrier conforming to the airline's required specific dimensions allows for some flexibility to fit under the seat in front of you. Lining the bottom of your carrier with a disposable puppy pee pad is a good idea and bring along extras to replace them when soiled or torn, as you will be underway for several hours.

In my experience, offering water to drink in a dish can result in a wet rabbit and carrier in-flight. I recommend bringing along fresh greens like cilantro, parsley, or mixed salad greens to help keep bunny hydrated while

flying. Another option is to moisten their food pellets with water -- if your rabbit will eat them that way -- in a plastic lightweight bowl, either before boarding or during the flight.

Bring hay in a large ziploc bag and place some inside the pet carrier to munch on, and bring extra hay along with you in case of flight delays, etc. I carry a several day supply of pelleted food with me in case their regular food is not available at our destination or my checked bag gets lost and I need to transition them to another food pellet.

Currently, it is not necessary to have a health certificate to transport your rabbit in-cabin domestically. If transporting via the cargo

hold - which I don't recommend unless in-cabin is not an option - the airline usually requires a veterinary health certificate. This means a vet visit is needed within 10 days of your flight for the health certificate and results in an extra cost.

Always double check all requirements for transporting your rabbit with your chosen airline well in advance, especially the recommended dimensions of the carry-on pet carrier.

Note that code share flights on other carriers typically do not honor their partner airlines' pet transportation policies, so be sure the flight you book is flown on a jet operated by United, Frontier, or Alaska Airlines.

Whether or not you choose to fly with your rabbit or to leave it behind in the care of a pet-sitter when you travel is a personal decision. In my experience, having travelled with my rabbits across the country by car and by jet, I think flying in-cabin is much easier on both the rabbits and me than several days of driving, with overnight hotel stays. Being well-prepared always pays off and makes for a smooth flying experience.

For international travel in-cabin with your rabbit, United Airlines, Westjet and FinnAir are currently the only options of which I'm aware. Choose a non-stop flight, if possible. Health certificates are usually necessary, as well as meeting any specific pet importation requirements pertaining to rabbits and any quarantine or vaccination requirements in the destination country.

Check with the embassy or consulate of your destination country for specific pet importation information before booking your plane ticket, and be aware that airlines often change their pet transportation policies.

For some, it may be worth hiring a professional pet transportation company to fly your rabbit abroad, although this tends to be an expensive option and means bunny is transported in the cargo hold, not in-cabin. But sometimes it is the only way your rabbit can be transported between certain countries and be able to rejoin you in another international location.

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Southeast Bunfest 2018 Was A Great Success

Southeast Bunfest 2018 ran on June 2nd and was a fantastic success. We interviewed Sara Kornegay about the event and Sara was also kind enough to provide all the photos for this pictorial.

Bunnyzine: What would you estimate was your total number of attendees and vendors?

Sara: We had approximately 1987 attendees. This is kind of an inaccurate number as we had folks from the vendors and the rescues coming

in not logged because they came in earlier than the folks that we were having logged this so we were probably well over 2000. As far as the vendors are concerned, we had 28 vendors which is more than we ever had and we look forward to working on the logistics of the venue, itself, to accommodate more.

Bunnyzine: Based on feedback from attendees, what are some of the most popular highlights of Southeast Bunfest 2018?











Sara: Our educational seminars. Everybody absolutely loved those. We had a lot of great folks this year. But not only that, our raffle baskets always blow away folks because not only how well they are put together but the contents that are in them. It's a wonderful array of items and people are really buzzing about the photos this year. We have a wonderful photographer. She is actually a humane society employee that has a secondary job as a photographer after

hours and on her days off so we had some really beautiful, really great quality photos so for only \$10 they got a photo session that would have pretty much cost them \$100+ just to get a couple of photos so it was beautiful.

Bunnyzine: What are some of the challenging obstacles that are faced in undergoing a huge event like this?





Sara: Our biggest obstacle is the communication with the volunteers, vendors, staff, rental companies and the venue itself. There's a lot of hands in the pot and there's a lot of room for error if everyone does not completely understand their role and how to execute it, so, we are working on that in the future,

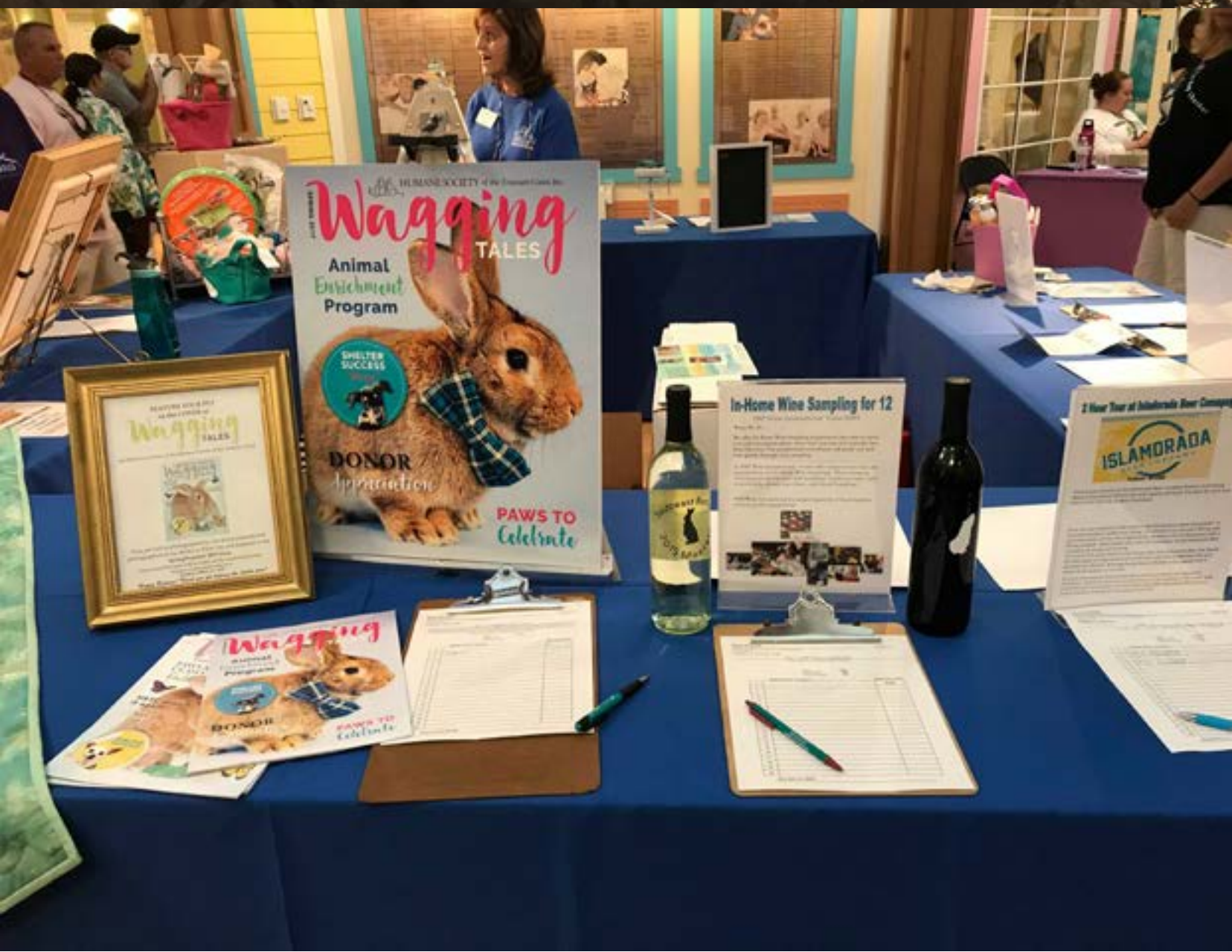
how to expedite it correctly, however, it's growing pains and every time we move to a new facility which this year 2018 was our first year at the Kane center.

It takes a little bit of wiggle room so maybe next year we will have it completely down pat.

Bunnyzine: People have been talking lately about not attending Bunfests until the RHDV 2 virus in British Columbia, Canada has been eradicated or until they have had their bunnies

vaccinated, I know you are down in Southeast where the risks are very, very, very low (ie: someone would have to catch RHDV 2 on them, and fly down to Southeast Bunfest) but I am curious whether or not the virus has had any noticeable impact on the attendance of Southeast Bunfest 2018.

Sara: We haven't seen any issues here. I don't believe it has actually caused folks not to come however it is something we've all been talking about because our local Petsmart, which we absolutely detest because they are a big problem, have been selling the "premium rabbits" that have been imported from Europe so really it's just a matter of time, however, our community is pretty strong and we are working towards eliminating, not just them, but eliminating them selling live animals







so hopefully we will make a dent in the community soon but it's not really something that has stopped folks.

Bunnyzine: How would you compare this year's turnout and metrics compared to previous years?

Sara: 2018's turnout has been bigger than ever. It grows bigger every year but this year we've seen more people only because we have a bigger facility, an updated facility for the animals and for the attendees. Also, we've been utilizing the Facebook ads and we've been able to reach more people and I think that really helps getting the word across. I always hear a week or two after the event "Oh Gosh, I wish I knew about this event sooner"; "How am I supposed to reach these people?" I think every year and I think "Gosh, I really have got to tap into social media more" and so we pulled out just a \$100 ad on social media and we targeted some spaces that were local and that were less than 2 hours from us and it definitely paid off.

Bunnyzine: For those who haven't had a Southeast Bunfest experience (especially those who are traveling from out of state/country), do people from the online bunny community congregate outside of the Southeast Bunfest event itself, and if so, what kind of things do they do?

The Emotional Rabbit

Monique Goosen is the bunny mom at the only special needs haven for rabbits in Africa. While there are many sanctuaries having some special needs rabbits, Southern Cape Bunny Haven has specialized in disabled and special needs rabbits, with Monique saving and caring for disabled rabbits for over 15 years now. These many years, and being far from proper veterinary care in earlier years, have taught Monique a lot about understanding the very complex nature of rabbits. Monique says: "It is not 'just a rabbit'. Bunnies are more emotional than most people I know."

Just like humans, rabbits can have very anxious natures. Bunnies can have anxiety attacks, or have a predisposed anxious nature, depending on what they have lived through, but some bunnies are just born anxious. Just like humans, anxious rabbits will need more safety, more assurance, and more care.

Anxiety should not be confused with anger issues, which have similar symptoms, but are displayed differently.

Chewing: One of the main signs of an anxious

rabbit is chewing. Not normal gnawing or chewing to shorten the front teeth on boxes and wood, but rather the chewing of fabric, bedding, clothing, and more. This is not just chewing, it is nearly a panicky destruction of what is in front of the bunny, in an attempt to get attention focused on him/her in order to be noticed and reassured.

Freezing: An anxious rabbit may suddenly freeze for no apparent reason other than something in the rabbit's mind that went array. It could be that something is seen as a threat, that is not actually a threat. The rabbit will freeze, barely breathing, in order not to attract any attention. Most predators react when seeing movement, and the rabbit reacts by freezing in order to escape detection.

Screaming: The Banshee yells of a rabbit is one of the most terrifying sounds to ever hear... they only scream in extreme circumstances,

usually when faced with an immediate life-threatening danger. However, a rabbit with an anxiety attack may scream for “no apparent reason” and you will see nothing that could have threatened it.

So, what causes a rabbit to have anxiety?

- **A Traumatic Past:** Domestic Rabbits, especially indoor rabbits that are abandoned or let go outdoors, have a minimal chance of survival. In cases where they ARE rescued, the stress that they endured while living outdoors can instill lasting anxiety in them post-rescue.
- **Rabbits with eye or ear problems:** In many cases where rabbits have compromised senses, they tend to be more anxious, especially while learning to cope in a new, unfamiliar environment while losing vision or hearing.
- **Babies born to a mother that had a highly stressful pregnancy:** These babies will start showing the symptoms only from around 6 weeks of age, and being re-homed in that time-span can cause their hearts to fail from stress. Rescued mothers need to have their babies with them until around 12 weeks of age to show them to be trusting, as she settles in.
- **Other factors include:** genetics, predisposition,

and more.

What can you do if you have an anxious rabbit?

A New rabbit:

Do not attempt to touch or pick the bunny up, at first. Rather, go sit down flat on the ground with the bunny, and just talk softly, read out loud or even sing softly so he/she can get used to your voice and see that you are not a threat. Have treats like rolled oats or small pieces of fruit ready, and just place it halfway between you and the bunny, moving it closer to you in the days to come.

An established rabbit:

Be as supportive as you can, not making sudden moves, loud noises or using any different smells near the rabbit. The known environment is the rabbit's safe place, and any new smells may make the bunny feel threatened. If your rabbit likes to be held or stroked, start touching him/her as soon as you see he/she is starting to panic.

Smoky is often nibbling & chewing when he is not cuddling in his mother's arms



when I have to stand up to attend to the other rabbits, he will start chewing if my husband does not hold him. Smoky will even chew my clothes while lying in my arms when I am sleeping too deep to comfort him. Not even using the full lights in the room will calm him enough to stop chewing. Not even me in the room will stop him chewing... I have to be there.

Smoky also has leaky gut syndrome from anxiety, as well as years of improper diet in the many feral years.

The Medical side of an anxious rabbit:

It is not only physiological problems that manifest in an anxious bunny. These buns have a much higher stasis risk, they get diarrhea much easier, and their hearts can fail quite easily. Anxious bunnies are definitely special needs bunnies, too!

I have to hold him, kiss him, and stroke him before he will calm down. He will only relax while in my arms.

Smoky is our rescue bun and has been with us for 2 years now. He is an extremely anxious rabbit and will have diarrhea or go into GI stasis for very little things that upset him. Smoky had been in the bush for about 4 years before we saved him, and was in a terrible way. He still gets violent nightmares where we have to hold him in order to stop him from kicking so hard that he could lphurt his back.

Smoky bonded with me quite fast, and I need to be present when he is experiencing an episode. He is absolutely terrified of the dark and the night, and we sleep with a night light. Smoky sleeps in the bed, in my arms. During the night,

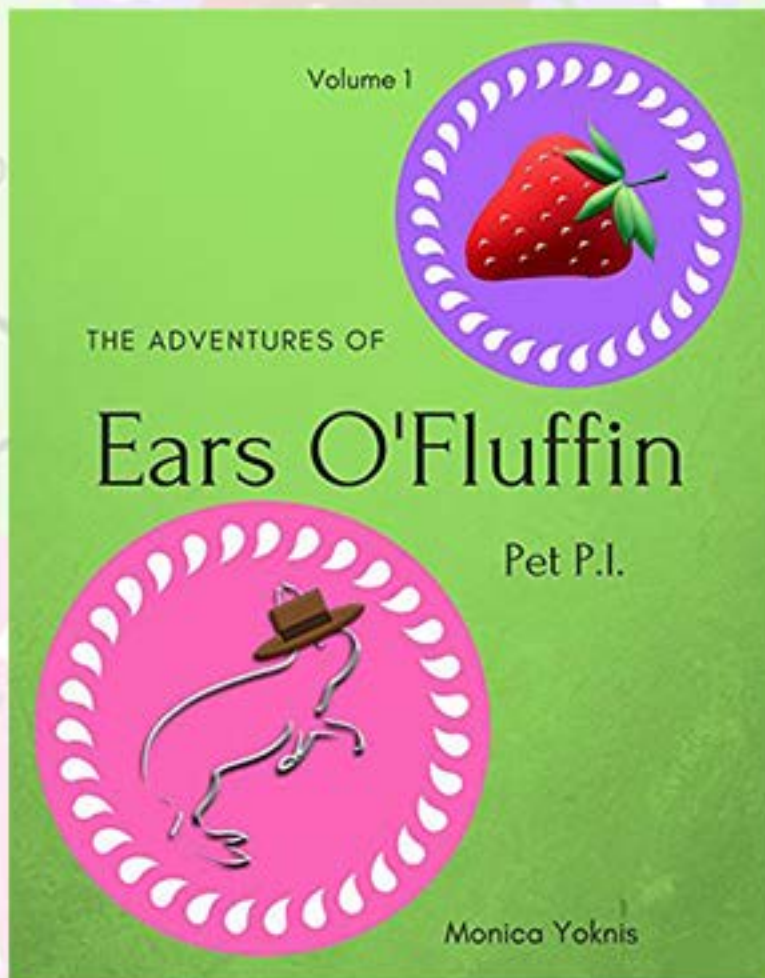
