The Virtual Midwest Bunfest opened on Oct 27th and will run for two weeks. This gives us a chance to still partake in the bunfest experience in it's virtual incarnate.

As an exciting treat, On Thursday November 8th, I will be hosting a live-stream event on the Bunnyzine YouTube channel (we'll post the link on our Facebook page). Warren Peace Bunny Sanctuary

Bunnyzine: Annie, when and why did you found Warren Peace Bunny Sanctuary? How long from inception of the idea to opening your doors to receive the first rabbits?

Annie (Antoinette) Monod: In 2005, Kelowna, BC had a feral rabbit problem. As a result, the city decided to cull them. Our initial thought was to save a few, but the need was so great we just kept going. Our doors opened in the spring of 2006 and the Warren Peace Bunny Sanctuary has never looked back.

Bunnyzine: How many rabbits currently make their home at Warren Peace Bunny Sanctuary and where do they come from?

Annie Monod: 250-300 rabbits call the Sanctuary home. Although most of the bunnies are local from the Okanagan to the Caribou regions of BC, it is not unusual for us to pick up bunnies at the airport from destinations farther away.

Bunnyzine: Do you have other animals besides rabbits at Warren Peace? What kinds?

Annie Monod: Yes, all small domestic animals are welcome here. Our residents include guinea pigs, chinchillas, ferrets, rats, mice, hamsters, gerbils, degus, hedgehogs, budgies, love birds, cockatiels, canaries, parrots, plus a few farm animals such as chickens, ducks, turkeys, pigs and our goat,

Bruno.

Bunnyzine: How do you decide which animals to accept to live out their lives at Warren Peace Bunny Sanctuary? Are you inundated with surrender requests?

Annie Monod: The Sanctuary is lucky enough to be on acreage, so if the need is there, we can expand. Most of the animals that come to the sanctuary have run out of options. The surrender requests are fairly easy to deal with, but we also help

live trap feral colonies, which is much more challenging.

Bunnyzine: How do you manage the daily care for so many Sanctuary animals?

Annie Monod: The majority of our residents are not in cages, but in large enclosures built with their needs in mind. We have the most loyal and amazing volunteers who not only keep the enclosures clean, but also make sure the animals are fed, watered, happy, healthy, and loved.

Bunnyzine: The lethal Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus broke out earlier this year in British Columbia. How did Warren Peace Bunny Sanctuary face this threat?

Annie Monod: First, we made the decision to close our doors to the public. We then set

up biosecurity measures for the volunteers. A crew of volunteers, along with Women in Trades from Okanagan College, renovated the rabbit housing to make it as secure as possible. Then an incredibly successful GoFundMe campaign was created to raise the funds needed to vaccinate our rabbits. Vaccination day went smoothly, with 2 vets

and a tech giving the health exams and vaccination shots on site. All of our rabbits made it through the ordeal, but we still decided to remain closed for the 2018 season, despite the loss of revenue.

Bunnyzine: How has closing the sanctuary to the public impacted your donations and fundraising this year? When do you envision re-opening to the public?

Annie Monod: We decided to play it safe and remain closed under protective quarantine for the rest of this year and will open our doors again Easter 2019. When this RHD2 outbreak began, I was not sure how we would survive, since the cost of the vaccines alone for so many rabbits was staggering. A large number of donors, volunteers and local community businesses contributed money, supplies and services. Funds for the vaccines came in, people put money on account at our local feed store, or on our vet bill. We set up a donation bin at the bottom of the driveway which is always full of veggies, fruit and bags of feed. The response has been truly overwhelming.

Bunnyzine: Your 'Boys with Buns' 2019 calendar is being released this month and is very popular. We were thrilled to learn this edition includes an image of Bunnyzine! Please describe how your calendar fundraiser came about and how our readers can order one.

Annie Monod: We are always trying to be proactive in our fundraising efforts and 'Boys with Buns' seemed to be the

perfect way to showcase the rabbits. Last year was our first attempt and the public loved it!!! We are now in the finishing stages of our 2019 calendar, which will be available soon in local stores or online through our Facebook page. We are thrilled to have Bunnyzine in our calendar — check out the month of May !!!

Bunnyzine: If a generous donor sent Warren Peace Bunny Sanctuary \$10,000 tomorrow, how would you choose to spend it?

Annie Monod: Easy answer. It would go towards next year's vaccinations, as that is roughly the cost to have all the bunnies

vaccinated. The vaccinations only last one year, so this is an ongoing expense for us now.

Bunnyzine: Fundraising must be a constant necessity for an animal sanctuary like Warren Peace. Tell us about some of your other fundraising activities.

Annie Monod: Our online auctions

are always very successful and gain in momentum each year. WPBS attends local functions where we sell bunny-themed items and answer questions about the Sanctuary. Usually, we are open to the public on Saturdays from Easter through Thanksgiving, with large numbers of people coming to spend time with our bunnies and volunteers. This is by donation and at the end of the summer is a big part of our

Annie Monod: You have to be serious, and you have to be dedicated. You will need volunteers, lots of them.

They will be your lifeline, they will be your family. Never take them for granted and always let them know how valuable they are. You will need donors, lots of them. They will be your saviours, they will be your friends. Never take them for granted and always let them know how valuable they are.

The animals in your care will bring you the greatest joy and the greatest heartache. Each day will bring new challenges and learning opportunities, embrace both as they are of equal importance. Remember, the heart of the Sanctuary is the animals, always remember the animals...

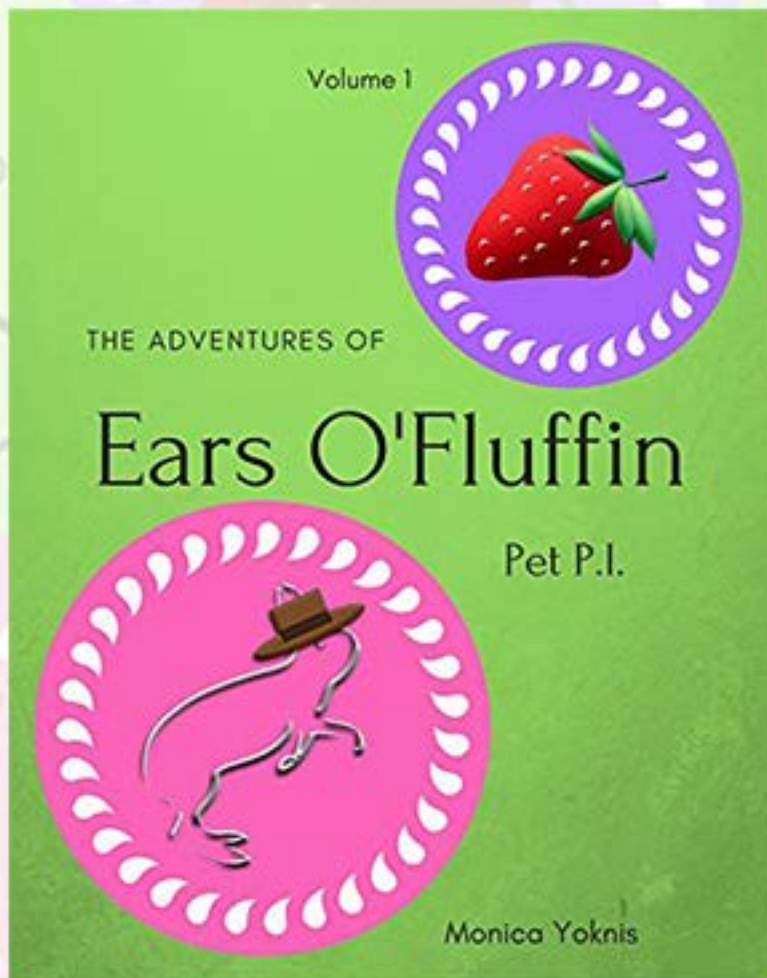

Saving Little Shrub Hare Francis

It was about 15h00 when the chopper did a routine flight over the gravel taxi way at the Mossel Bay airport. Suddenly, pilot Stefan Fouche saw a little ball of something on the ground. The chopper blades' downward wind caused the little ball to suddenly roll over and tumble – and he recognized it was a little hare!

He backed away, jumped out and went to pick up the little hare before the aeroplanes that were supposed to follow on that runway to do Skydiving and training would harm it. Stefan looked around, but saw no other hares, no nest, nor signs of digging —

nor a mama hare. So, Stefan took the little one back with him.

Back in the building, Stefan gave the little hare to another pilot, Allan, who he knew had rabbits. As soon as Allan saw the little hare, he immediately contacted Southern Cape Bunny Haven, since he knew we dealt with special needs rabbits.

In a huge team effort, Alan's friend Inge-Liese bought the Royal Canin Kitty milk per instruction, and they headed out to the farm where the Haven is situated.

When little hare Francis came to us, she was very weak, had bumps all over, had a slight







respiratory infection and a weepy eye. Judging from her condition, Francis had been exposed to the wind and weather for a while. Little hares of 3 days old, as she was, normally do not leave the nest yet, so something must have happened to the mama hare or the nest was dug up and Francis escaped.

Francis is a Shrub Hare, which are actually quite scarce in the area where we live and the Cape Hare is predominant. Little Francis has a little white spot on the top of her head and just loves cheek-rubs!

After 3 days of milk and rooibos tea she is quite strong; the eye infection and runny nose have cleared up completely. She gets milk with rooibos tea every three hours, as the milk itself is too strong and the tea gives it the "wild" taste of the mom's milk. She refuses the milk if served plain.

We do pajama-parade, and her best playtime is from 12 -3 where she will amble along and even dig to get our attention to be picked up. Because she is solitary, we need to give her more human interaction, otherwise she will not develop her social skills as she should.

Once weaned, she will go to a suitable wildlife rehabilitation centre. To see video clips of Francis, visit the Southern Cape Bunny Haven FB page.

Little Francis also had a newspaper article written about her in the South African newspaper, Die Burger.

The story of little hare, Francis, has touched many in South Africa, and symbolizes the hope and empathy that still exist here, despite a difficult economic and political situation.

will take on a "fight or flight" attitude, and may either attack YOU, or just flee. Scared rabbits that attack are often labeled aggressive, but really they just need more reassurance and time to adapt to their new situation.

Many rabbits end up dumped because they weren't given time to accept their new areas, or people just did not take time to build trust in their rabbits. Rabbits that did not have human interaction when they were small, or rabbits that had bad experiences with humans are the ones that often need more time to adapt and to learn to trust.

So, how do we build trust to the Acceptance

Getting your rabbit to accept you may feel like a losing battle at first, if you don't have a very laid back rabbit. Rabbits that feel threatened

phase? We start off like in the previous article, by not smelling of strange things, and not making lots of noise.

Now how to start interacting with your bunny:

Sit in the middle of his enclosure or play area with your cellphone or a book. Bonding cannot happen when the rabbit is in a hutch or a small cage (and your rabbit does not deserve a caged life.) Not talking of night times etc but when the bun has ample play time outside of the confined space, but of people that permanently want to keep the rabbit(s) in the confined space. A rabbit must be able to run at least 4 jump-lengths if they are only in one area.

So, it is Playtime, and you let the bun out into the playpen. Go and sit right in the middle of the pen, talk softly to the bun, sing softly, read out loud, or do anything that will make the rabbit used to your voice. Do not attempt to touch the rabbit at all, don't even make direct eye contact. The rabbit will then sense you are not a threat and will start to investigate you – come to sniff you, even jump on top of you. Don't make sudden movements, and don't raise your voice at all.

Your VOICE is the key to building trust up to acceptance and to love. The tone of your voice will tell a rabbit immediately what you feel, and how they need to react in future. If you yell at your rabbit – or even a house mate – your rabbit will sense the anger and frustration and will hide from you.

Trusting Rabbits will let you groom them



When your rabbit starts to accept you, he/she will not run away or get aggressive the moment that you get close to it, but will start letting you touch it.

A rabbit that gains acceptance of his/her new environment will soon be a joyful rabbit!

Binky's Overseas Adventure: Canadian Prairies to Switzerland

I was very happy to be accepted as a postdoctoral fellow in Geneva, Switzerland. Shortly after, my excitement was followed by panic. How would I bring Binky with me?! Binky is my 7.5-year-old rescue rabbit, so it was important to transport her with minimal stress.

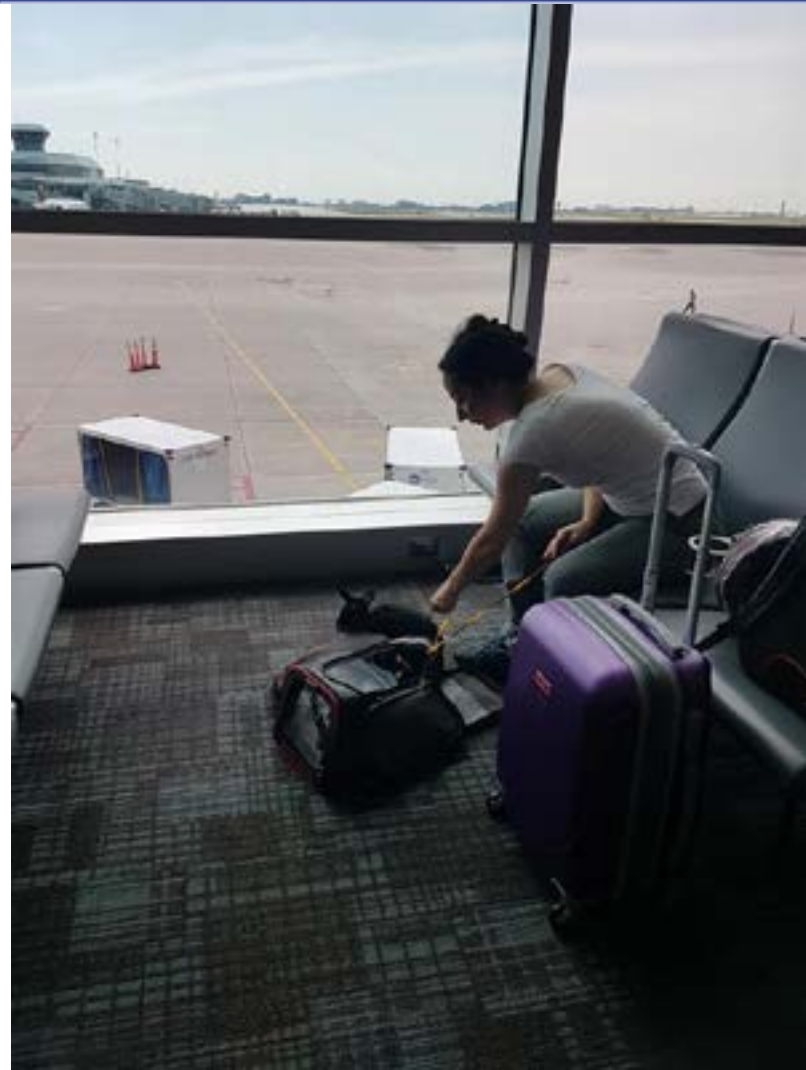
Here is the step-by-step story of our adventure from Saskatoon, Canada to Geneva, Switzerland in August 2018.

Step 1: Check the rules for bringing a rabbit into the country you are moving to. The rules are different for each country and the duration of your stay. For Switzerland



and France (my final destination was Geneva, but my port of entry into Europe was Paris), the only requirement for pet rabbits is a health certificate from a certified veterinarian.

Step 2: Find an airline that allows rabbits in the cabin. WestJet is a rabbit-friendly airline...except for their overseas flights! So, I had to find an alternative airline that would get me to... well, anywhere in Europe. Once in Europe, train rides are easy, and they all accept rabbits. My solution was Corsair, which has flights from Montreal to Paris. This was my 27-hour route: Saskatoon



was very good at eating and drinking the whole time! During layovers, I took Binky out on a leash and she hopped around a bit to stretch her legs. I also opened the top of the carrier case often to pet her and let her peek around. All the flights and the layovers were uneventful. Close to the end of our journey, Binky was bored out of her mind, but overall, she was so patient and well-behaved!

It was a very stressful day for both of us, but I think it went much smoother than I had anticipated. Checking Binky every 15

to Toronto and then to Montreal with WestJet, and then on to Paris with Corsair, and finally, arriving in Geneva by train.

Step 3: Get ready for the big journey. I prepared Binky's luggage (yes, she had luggage!) a couple days before and made sure I had enough of everything that I might need, not only for the journey, but also for the first few days in Geneva.

Step 4: The big journey! I brought several puppy training pads with me. I lined the bottom of the carrier with one and changed it every 4 hours or so. I brought lots of fresh greens (kept in a plastic bag with water-soaked paper towels), pellets, and treats. I did not bother with hay because it is messy and I knew Binky doesn't eat hay when she is stressed. I also brought a plastic cup for water. I offered food and water every half an hour. Binky





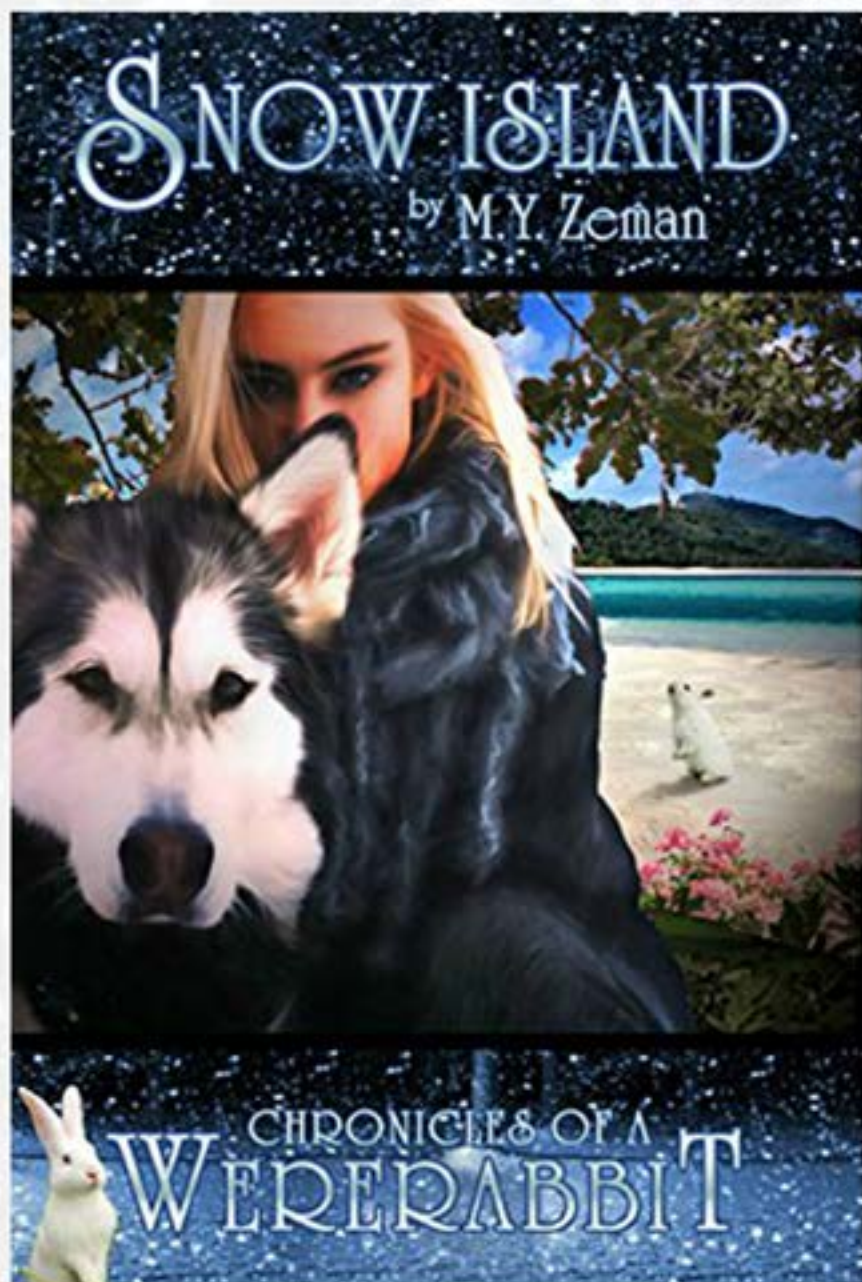
minutes for almost 30 hours was very exhausting, but she appreciated my attention the whole time!

I want to emphasize that the whole trip was expensive. I spent an extra \$1000. This includes the detour we had to take (instead of much shorter, cheaper flight options), the pet fee for airlines, the extra luggage fees, the vet visits, the health certificate, and the things we bought for the travel (travel carrier case, puppy pads, extra treats...etc.). I would have spent another \$1000 if I had to, because leaving Binky behind was never an option for me. I was ready to decline the job offer if I could not find a way to bring her with me. Being a pet parent is a big responsibility and one of the most rewarding experiences in life. When you adopt a pet, they become part of your family. Forever.
