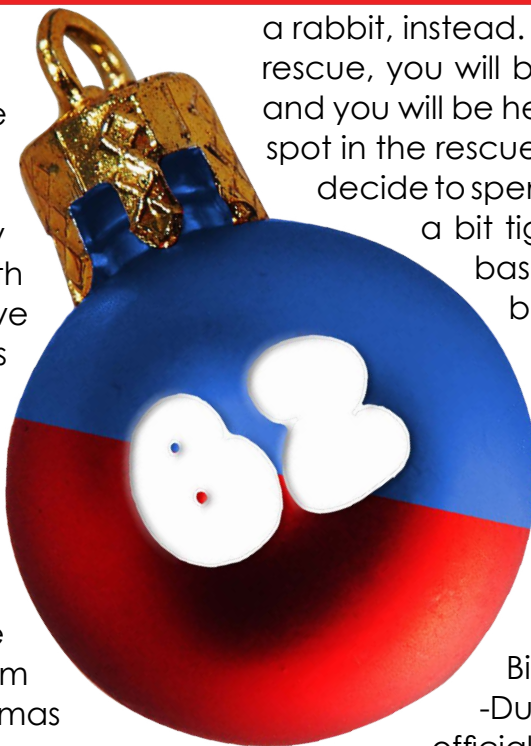

Rabbits Around The World - Philippines

Andrea Espineda is a furparent of 5 bunnies. She acquired her first rescue bunny in 2015. Since then, she has dedicated herself to educating new rabbit lovers on proper care.

Mabuhay from Manila, Philippines!

Rabbits, you say? I'm not really sure when we started keeping them as pets in The Philippines, but one thing I am sure about: love for rabbits is



spreading like wildfire! And, so is the notion that rabbits live only 2-3 months. The horror!

Given the nature of bunnies and that they're very easy to breed, most people here unfortunately breed irresponsibly. Rabbits are often given as gifts, bought as project at school as 'bring your pet,' used to experiment on (yes this happened here!), and some people want to have them as pets and part of their family.

The darker side of the story is that rabbits are also being raised for slaughter around 5 months of age as meat rabbits. It's a sad, harsh reality, but some of us are working to stop this trend, despite being ganged up on online by breeders and rabbit meat eaters.

There are various rabbit breeds available in The Philippines, from New Zealanders to Flemish Giants. Wild rabbits are non-existent here, but sometimes we receive reports of pet rabbits on the roadside or running loose in neighborhoods. Possibly these are rabbits who have escaped from their cages, or worse, were 'set free' by their owners.

The usual way of acquiring rabbits in The Philippines is for breeders to import them from overseas. Rabbits can be acquired everywhere from pet shops to online Facebook groups (despite Facebook's official no selling of live animals policy, it's still done as "rehoming.")

Pet rabbits are usually kept in bird or dog cages here, and given little to no exercise at all. However, some people are kind enough to have them in x-pens or as free-roaming indoor house bunnies. Despite educating owners on





are sold for food.

Rabbit-savvy vets have existed here for a long time since we also have other exotic pets available. People living in the city have fairly good access to veterinary care, but in the provinces, it's a bigger challenge. We are quite lucky not to have to worry about myxomatosis and other dreaded viruses that can threaten rabbits, so no vaccines are required for rabbits here. We mostly see rabbit illnesses like ear infections, diarrhea, runny nose, abscesses, eye problems, malocclusion, splayed legs, fur mites, mange, and heat stroke.

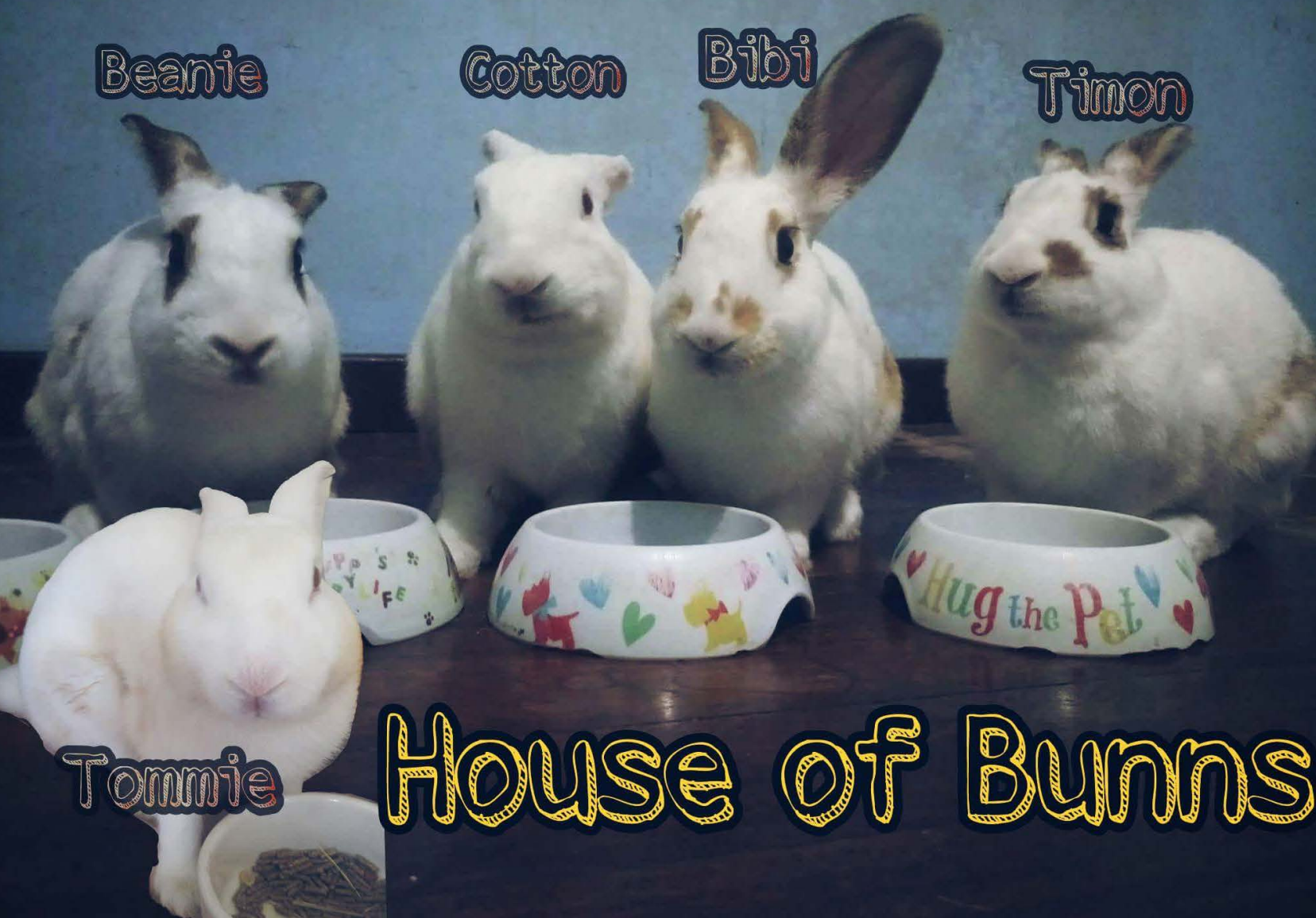
I've observed that often rabbits are bought impulsively, because they are cute, cuddly, and cheap. Usually, no prior research is done

the proper housing for their new members of the family, the majority still opt for the cheapest alternative – cages.

The majority of hay-based rabbit pellets and hay are not available here. Most rabbit foods being offered by the local groups include feeds for chickens, pigs, etc. Since we don't have timothy hay here, the alternative is some local grass the nutritional content of which is still unknown. Some local groups claim, based on their experience, that these local grasses are as suitable - or even healthier alternatives - than the branded "expensive ones" from Chipsi Meadow Hay, Versele-Laga Natural Hay, and Hartz Timothy Hay. But for me, I stick to what is considered the international standard.

Rabbit savvy-vets exist and so do fur parents who spay/neuter their rabbits. Desexing is not being encouraged by most local groups, since they promote a sustained livelihood with rabbit breeding and selling them as pets, and also selling rabbit meat as a cheap alternative meat. One can buy a pair of rabbits here for US\$4. It may seem like a good opportunity for people to invest very little and earn a profit, while rabbits die from irresponsible breeding and

and people have no idea that rabbit vets/exotic vets exist. Once people have been made aware about bringing their sick bunnies to the vet, they often complain about the expensive consultation fees and the cost of spay/neuter surgery.

Mostly, it's young people buying rabbits here. High school students buy rabbits, and young rabbits die because of lack of knowledge and/or because people can't afford to seek vet assistance. The cycle goes on, since rabbits are cheap

pets to start with, and they can just easily replace their dead bunny of less than 1 month of age. Adults handle rabbits differently here. For those who have done proper research, they join our pet rabbit care groups. But a majority still go straight to other local groups that cater to raising rabbit meat and breeding, unfortunately.

Our biggest challenge at the moment, is to officially remove rabbits from the livestock category in The Philippines. There have been new groups founded and duly acknowledged by the Bureau of Animal Industry here to this end. It could be a lengthy, difficult fight.

We are hoping our petition to classify rabbits as non-meat and to regulate breeding will be approved.

The Emotional Rabbit

Monique Bosch Goosen is Namibian born and spent her life in Namibia's rural areas as Lodge Manager for remote Lodges. Her first bunny, Dingles, travelled with her for 12 years, across the whole country. Monique currently stays in the Garden Route, running Southern Cape Bunny Haven where she is now rescuing and loving her disabled and special needs bunnies.

From the day that the Fuzzy four were born, one bunny stood out. This little bun had a small white "pencil-line" on her nose. Further, the four newborn bunnies was identical.

We had Gremlin's enclosure in our room, we helped her build her nest when she frantically started building, thinking she had another phantom – she had 4 at that stage. We couldn't have Gremlin spayed, as she was a rescue from a horrible situation, and the vets said that she would never be strong enough for anesthetic again after they saved her.

2 weeks later, at about 11 in the morning (which is a quite uncommon time) she gave birth the little pink miracles. The first few days the babies did what babies bunnies did best. Sleep, sleep and sleep. On the 5th night, we woke up to a frantic, screaming Gremlin, and in switching on the lights, saw one little bunny had crawled out of the nest. The little one was crawling all over the cage in a record speed, something we didn't think possible, crawling all over to get to Gremlin. And Gremlin frantically trying to get away from the baby. At first we thought the little one hungry, but it had a well rounded little body. I read before that a bunny mom cannot pick their young up and carry them around, so I picked up the little one and started to warm it. I saw the little stripe on the nose. We sat discussing the happening, and we decided to call her Fudgie. (Hubby exclaimed "Oh Fudge!" when he saw the little one crawling all over)

It became basically an every-night happening. Fudgie broke out of the nest, crawled over the rims of the box (we still do not know how she did it) and searched for her mom. Hubby didn't even wake up anymore, and I was so glad that they slept in our bedroom.

Raising Fudgie

When their eyes opened, the babies were all wide eyed and alert, except for Fudgie. Her eyes only opened on day 11, while the others started day 9. Soon after their eyes opened, they started exploring. Again, all did except for Fudgie, that always went to lie with mom Gremlin. When it was food time, Fudge was eating well – in fact, she was the one that always wanted first! Fudgie's hair on her head were always ruffled, while the others always lied smooth. And she never opened her eyes as wide as the others. So, we knew Fudgie was different. We sexed the babies on 3 weeks, thus knew Fudgie was a girl. The bunnies started playing, running and jumping, except for Fudgie who freaked out when they wanted to play and went to Gremlin to hide. We had a little rescue kitten called Minx and introduced them. Fudgie cuddled up to minx for a while, and then decided this wasn't as good as her mom, whom she spent just about every minute she could with. Sometimes I picked up Fudgie and sat with her so Gremlin could get me time, as she was not feeling good.

with nature, it gave us time to learn so much about a very special little bun!

When the babies were 16 weeks, all the other bunnies attacked Fudgie, all chased her. We gave her her very own space, and she dragged her blankies into a box and lied there for 3 days, coming out only for a quick nibble and wee.

It was the same time that we had to take Caramel for his snip. We kept him separate from the girls from week 14. But Caramel and Toffee had a strong bond


and they really fought to be together. We took up the drive of 180km to go to a great, rabbit savvy vet. Fudgie accompanied Caramel and again

Fudgie had this strange "thing" of chewing off all the other bunnies' whiskers, even Gremlins. We could never stop her. Even today, when she can get to whiskers through the wire, she will chew them off.

Gremlin passed away shortly before Christmas, after being on and off ill the whole time after their births. We first thought snuffles, that was ruled out; so we thought teeth. Gremlin was taken to a vet, who found nothing wrong. Upon her death, we finally found that Gremlin had bad cancer in her throat and chest. We showed Gremlin's body to the little ones, so that they could understand that she passed. While the other 3 bunlets sniffed and then went off after a short while, Fudgie wanted to pluck Gremlin's hair... so we had to separate her.

We started off with a very sad Christmas and an inconsolable Fudgie, who only wanted her mom. Fudgie started spending more time with me, being carried in my pocket, sitting on my lap when I worked.

So came Christmas and Fudgie spent about 6 hours a day in my arms, in my pocket, chewing all my zippers and buttons. Fudgie was my Special Christmas gift – the little bun that was not to survive, that pulled through. In normal circumstances, the little bun that crawled out of the nest would pass from exposure within half an hour, but we got her in time – and while some would say we interfered

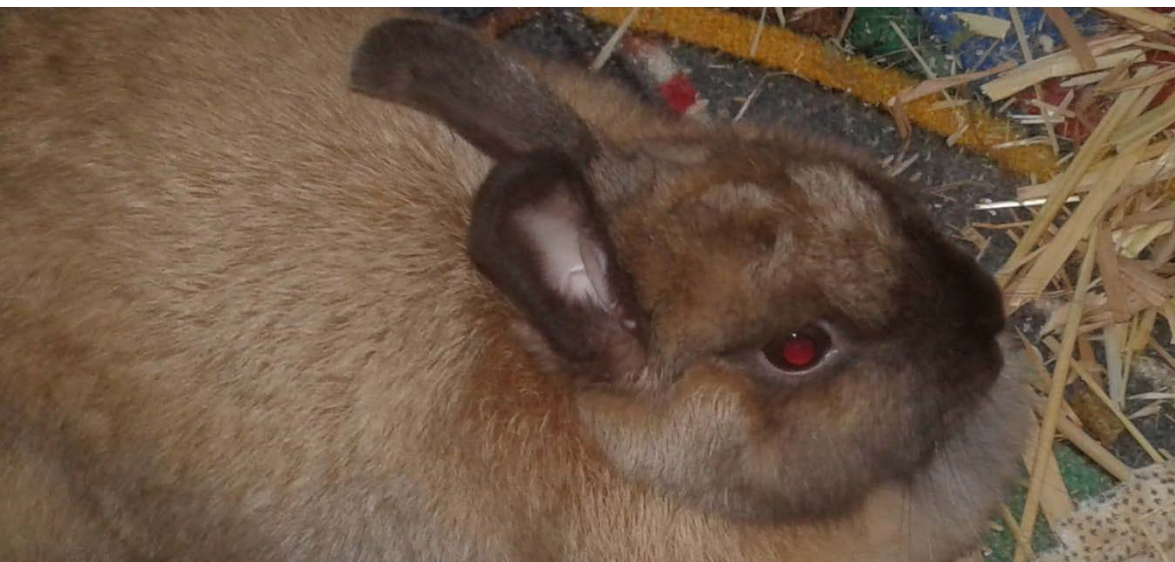

we saw that she acted totally strange.

Blood was drawn from Fudgie and tested.... Fudgie had a chromosome halved, not normal. Nearly like a Down syndrome, where a chromosome was missing. So, Fudgie was classified as "Down Syndrome like". The vets and researchers wanted more tests as this intrigued them, and we had to decide.... Keep Fudgie and make sure she is safe and comfortable, or send her in for tests and not

know what happens to her, but also not know the extent of her disorder. I decided to keep Fudgie and document her behaviour myself. It is thus unofficial, but my baby girl is safe and protected with me. We documented weights, eating, behaviour. We couldn't let this girl go to strange people. She was too scared, too introvert and too much part of my family and my heart.

We soon found that Fudgie panicked the moment it got dark, and set her up with a night light. Funny enough, her dad, Smoky, is even more scared of the dark than she is!



From age 3 months, Fudgies hair on her head never lied flat. She also do not bath with both hands and washing her face like a normal bunnies.

In April, when Pippen (he was about 5 then, lost his bonded mate to death and was severely depressed) found his way to us, I took Fudgie to meet him before the long drive back. Because she is totally submissive, as is he, she gave him a calm welcome and they were both quiet on the 90km

drive home. Pippen spent his first week in Fudgie's enclosure, but he and Coffee immediately fell in love. After a week, Fudgie chased Pippen and freaked out. She wanted HER space. WE put Pippen with Coffee, whom he now knew well as there were only wire between them. They bonded immediately, and Fudgie was happy – she had HER room back to herself. But though she wants HER own space, she panics when she cannot see Coffee or Pippen.

She never had any hormonal behaviour, were never interested in fighting, spraying, friends, boyfriends.... Also she is the only bun that never drops a little poop outside her litter-box. Not

one. Furthermore, Fudgie is the only of all of the bunnies in the haven that never had stasis. She eats very poorly and we have make sure she gets enough in, coaxing her with extra food, but she never had stasis.

When we moved house and Haven, Fudgie was the one that I had to worry about, as she does not do good with any change. She has HER blankies and stuff and Fudgie does not share at all.....

we blocked her off totally except for letting her see Pippen and Coffee. Pippen is so sweet, he grooms her through the wire and calms her, lying next to her when she needs company – as long as no one comes into HER space.

The Fuzzy 4 turned 1 end of September and Fudgie has started regressing. She have times where she wants to be picked up, but they are now scarce and far in-between. She panics the moment that something is out of place in her cage, or if she cannot see her sisters. Fudgie is very scared of Caramel, and refuse to get close to any other rabbit, except her sisters and Pippen. I make a point of giving extra time to Fudgie every day, as I know that she will not have a long time on this earth. She is already looking and acting like a 9 year old, with the mentality of an 8 week old bunlet.

Having a Down Syndrome like bun in your house is very special. Very wanting, very needy and very rewarding to have her here. My special bun would have been dead in normal circumstances, the very first night that she crawled out. We bought a bit of time to get to know her and she is such a sweetie!

Fudgie taught us even more that Bunnies are the same, or even more emotional than humans. They also have mental disabilities, like humans. They can feel every single emotion that humans can.... And these emotions can intensify 100fold with a special needs and disabled bun.

We again have baby bunnies in the Haven for Christmas, with Heidi-Moose, a rescue girl, giving birth to 10 wonderfully big and healthy babies on 24 November! Fudgie and all of us here at the Southern Cape Bunny Haven wish all a wonderful Holiday Season!

I (Iris) saw Kaitlyn's story on the House Rabbit Society FB page last month. BZ reached out to her to learn more about how her rabbits have improved her health and well-being. Kaitlyn is a 22 year old college student residing in New York state with her two bunnies, and this is her uplifting story.

I want to tell you the story of how two little 4 pound balls of fluff we call bunnies saved my life! You see, I've suffered from anxiety, depression, and PTSD since I was 7 years old. I've done everything I could think of to get relief. I've been on every medication, seen countless therapists and psychiatrists, and I've even been hospitalized 4 times. While these things have been helpful, there was certainly room for improvement. I still felt incredibly hopeless and alone.

financially stable, and was looking into adopting a small companion. I've always loved and felt connected to animals, and had the feeling that adopting one of my own would do wonders. Completely by chance, a friend's coworker had a beautiful mini rex that was looking for a home. I remember telling my friend that I was looking for small pet, and she said: "I can get you a rabbit for free anytime you want." My mind was blown! I saw pictures of her and instantly fell in love. I spent the next few days gathering all the information I could on how to care for rabbits and keep them healthy and happy.

Once I felt ready, I brought my Cocoa Puff home. I couldn't believe how much better life was, almost



Everything changed when I got my first rabbit, Cocoa Puff. I was in a point in my life where I was

instantly. She was my reason for getting up in the morning. She depended on me, and I made a promise to always care for her. If I couldn't get up

for myself, I would still get up for her. Watching her get more and more comfortable with me made me feel so accomplished and loved.

Soon e started jumping up to sit in my lap and take food out of my hand. I loved watching her

brother became aggressive towards each other and had to be separated, brought back to the shelter, and eventually went back into foster homes.

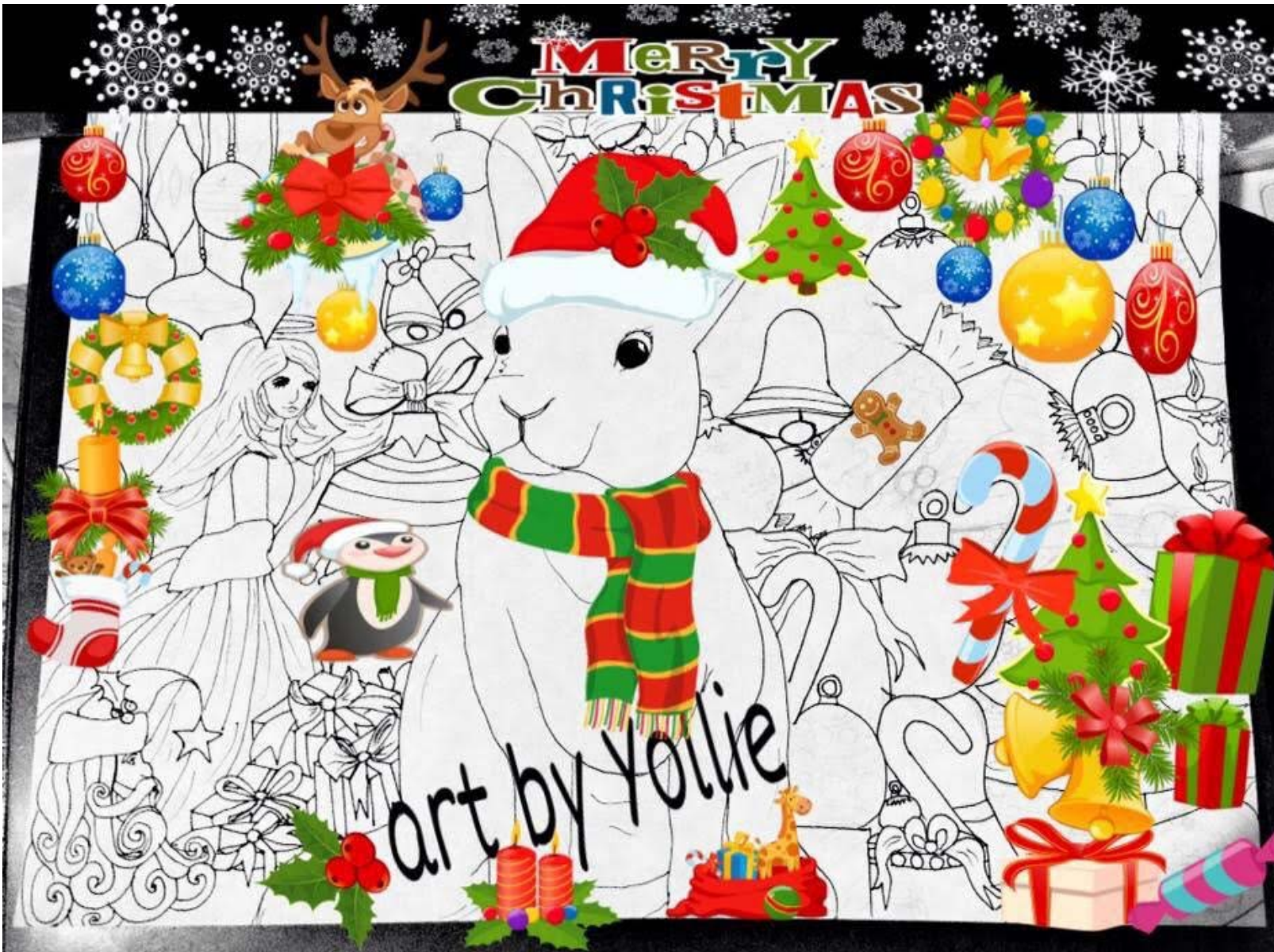

I never knew how much my life would change thanks to two little rabbits. They rescued me just as much as I rescued them, and maybe even a little more. The bond between animals and humans is truly an amazing thing. Never let anyone tell you it's "just a rabbit".

"At least for now."

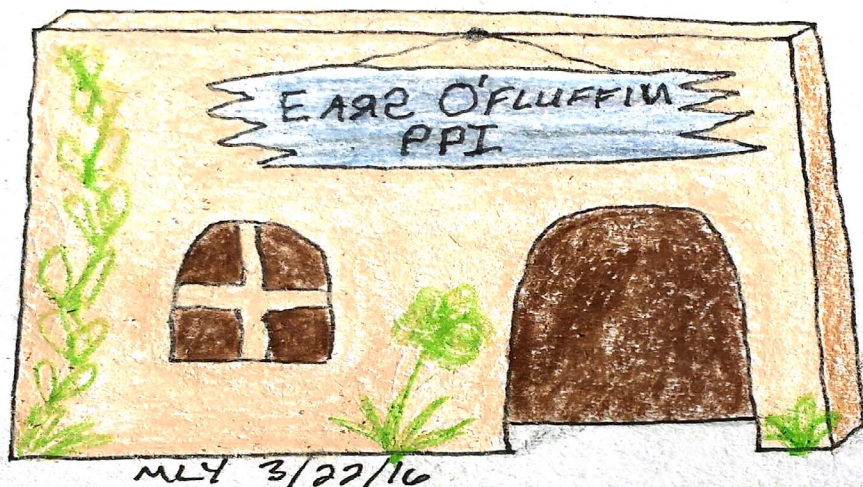
We sat thinking, but I couldn't come up with any other assumptions. The question now was, how does one find a needle in a pile of hay?

Book Review: Tiffo And The Magic Carrot

Early Bunnyzine readers may remember our Bunnyzine issue on Tiffo and Chany from our Vol 2 Issue 4 Valentine's edition. This sweet couple has always endeared me and so I was really excited when I discovered they have a book! Tiffo And The Magic Carrot.

Written by Laura Chiara Gramigna, illustrated by Loredana Daddi, and translated by Paola de Rosa, the book runs just over 100 pages and is a delightful, easy read and is a great story for anyone from 8 years old to adulthood.

The book opens with Tiffo munching on a carrot and Chany struck with a desire to go exploring the living room. She tries to talk Tiffo into going with her but he rejects her persuasion attempts. She flushes out the reason he won't go is because he

is scared of the cat (that snoozes all day), so she takes the opportunity to tell Tiffo of an incredible story of a time when rabbits weren't scared; they were brave.

It is from this point, we too, are drawn in to Chany's story.

Chany's story is that of a classic fairy tale and it contains all the tropes one would expect: A medieval setting with a King. A cast of vibrant characters and a team of heroes. Prophecy and mysticism. A great perilous quest much larger than the average rabbit would face. A series of progressive challenges and objectives needed to be met in order to tackle the final challenge. Chany's story is jam-packed full of everything classic stories are known for. The detail and descriptive text sweeps the reader into Chany's story and the flow of staying on point keeps the reader immersed without being weighed down by overembellishments or excessive detailing. The story is tactfully written with a delicate balance of vivid imagery without hindering on the pace of the story.

So what was Chany's story about?

It opens with a competition to see who would become the next rabbit to hold the title of King. A series of events that one of the main protagonists, Tiffo (yes, Chany is telling a story that has Tiffo and Chany in the story, it's really cute.) competes in but the games are interrupted as a group of Eagles kidnap the current King and whisk him away. It is up to Tiffo (as later prophesized) and Chany to save the King but the cannot do it without help. First, they must quest to find the magic carrot, which will aid them in facing the eagles but even this task will require them to traverse through a path where they hope to gain the knowledge and support they will need for this quest.

How does the story end and will it change Tiffo's mind about exploring the living room? Whoops, I've run out of room on this page. I recommend that you buy this book and find out for yourself.

This is one I'm definitely keeping in my collection.

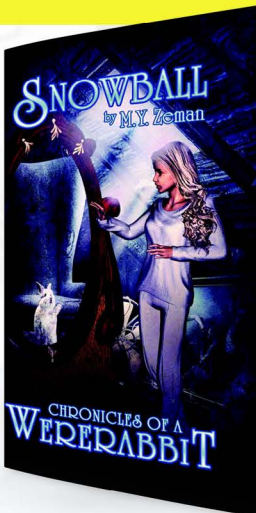

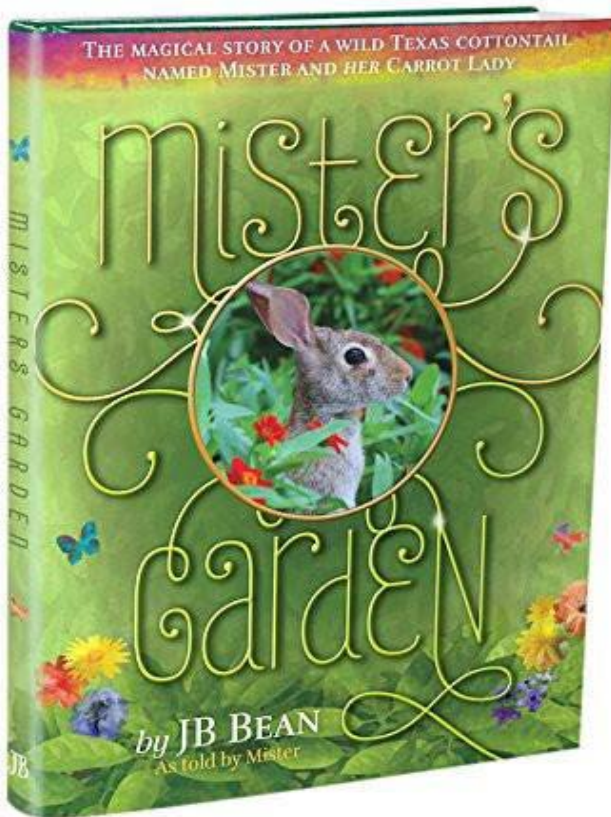

Book Reviews: Mister's Garden and Be Safe

For those who don't know The Carrot Lady, she runs the Mister Facebook page (listed below). She has wild bunnies frequenting her property and she provides them with luxuries most wild bunnies never get. It all started with the first bunny: Mister. I had been a fan for a very long time (back when Mister was still thought to be a boy until she had babies) so when I heard The Carrot Lady was going to be at Midwest Bunfest, I knew I had to meet her and I know I had to buy her books "Mister's Garden" and "Be Safe"



Review: Mister's Garden

Full disclosure: this review is going to be biased. It's unavoidable.

Unlike picking up a book containing a story I had never read, I already knew about Mister. I had already seen hundreds of photos and watched a plethora of videos of Mister. So, for me to read this, it was like a nostalgic trip down memory lane. This is not to say that if you don't know Mister, you wouldn't enjoy the book. No, no. In fact, I believe The Carrot Lady (a.k.a. author JB Bean) intentionally and skillfully wrote the book to welcome newcomers while fans of Mister got to relive the experience and she did this in a very unique way; the story is told from

Mister's perspective.

Better yet, the story begins long before the Facebook page was up so even us long-time fans received the unexpected treat of an origins story.

We learned about Mister's initial sessions of observing The Carrot Lady and carefully strategizing Mister's introduction. As we journey through Mister's story, we (the biased long-time fans) start getting goosebumps when events that we were around for start coming up in the story, such as Mister's tick bite, or meeting Ginger Sprite and Nutmeg (Mister's daughter and granddaughter). This book is more than just Mister and just The Carrot Lady. It is the creation of a community of bunnies who are able to live a little longer and thrive a little more from the care and compassion The Carrot Lady provides.

The (160 page, 8.5' x 11') book is more than just the amazing story of Mister. It is also a keepsake picture album. Those who visit Mister's page already know of the amazing and high-quality photos The Carrot Lady captures and posts on the page. Those same quality photos are used in this book and the printing and quality of the pages upholds the standard that Mister's pictures deserves. In fact, I dare not question how little profit must be made because I know the cost of printing and this book, listed at a low price, for 160 high-quality pages tells me the profit margin isn't as high as it should be for the work that went into this book along with just the sheer value and content volume of this book alone.

There is remarkable detail put into the pages. Most readers would be happy with pictures of Mister and the story but JB Bean takes it one step



further and has the pages beautifully decorated with background illustrations that accentuate the layout without upstaging neither the story nor the pictures.

If you are a fan of Mister, this IS a must-have. If you have not heard of Mister, check out the Facebook page first and you can sample what high level of quality photos that are in the book and soak in some of the story as you peruse through the page, and then buy the book because it's a must-have for everyone.

Review: Be Safe

Be Safe is an imaginative re-telling of Mister's story of her unfolding relationship with The Carrot Lady but this time, JB Bean's audience is children (and fans of Mister because, gosh darnit, I'm not afraid to admit that I have a children's book in my collection).

Instead of photographs assisting the story (as it does in Mister's Garden) all of the images are beautiful illustrations by Olga Lea that perfectly capture the emotions of the scenes.

When I mentioned, earlier, that this was an imaginative re-telling of the story in Mister's Garden, I feel the need to be more specific.

In this re-telling, Mister is constantly reminded to Be Safe in a variety of situations (the situations themselves are based on the actual events that are more thoroughly explored in Mister's Garden but those extra details aren't needed in the telling of this story). Those two little words, be safe, keep Mister intrigued on exactly what they mean because, with the constant change of circumstance, it becomes difficult to pinpoint the concept of it. Mister becomes elated when she finds out what it means (and I'm not going to tell you what it is because I also was elated and don't wish to spoil it for you.)

I'm sure you have probably guessed, I'm



recommending this book. I love it. As my disclaimer at the beginning of Mister's Garden review mentions. I am biased. I am a fan of Mister. So with that in mind, I'd like to give you some non-biased reasons why I recommend this book.

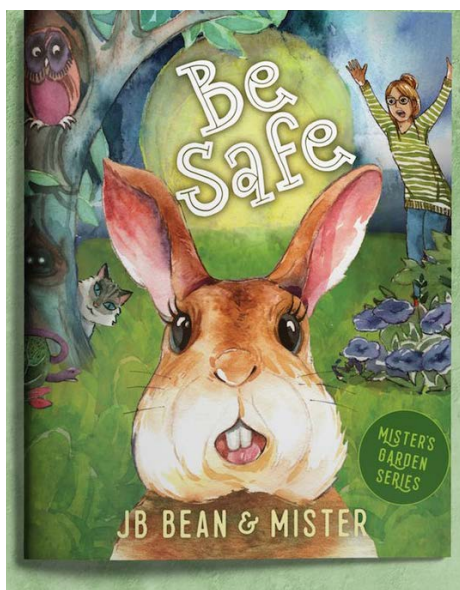
First, it's length. 52 pages might seem long for a bedtime story but most of the page space is reserved for the beautiful illustrations to enjoy. The text, itself, is kept short with most pages only containing a sentence or two.

Secondly, the lettering. Nice big letters with a large word sampling that are free from anything complicated. This will make it easy for a child to read on their own (or along with a parent) and it signifies to me that the children were kept in mind when creating this.

Thirdly, the interactivity. Throughout the different situations where Mister is told to be safe, the words "Be Safe" are embedded into the environment; semi-hidden. This

gives a perfect opportunity for parents to engage their children into finding where the "be safe" is on the page, while also encouraging them to point out where the dangers for Mister are located.

All-in-all, this heart-warming story with colourful illustrations and engaging interactivity are my unbiased reasons for getting this book. My biased reasons are because it's about Mister and every fan of Mister recognizes the words "Be Safe" as The Carrot Lady (JB Bean) says this to the bunnies in virtually every video she shares with us.
